
The WHO Global Network for Agefriendly Cities and Communities currently includes 1542 cities and communities in 51 countries, covering over 320 million people worldwide.







Caregiver Respite Services provide safety, companionship, supervision, and other non-medical services that allow the primary caregiver time away for other activities.










